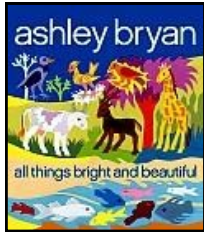

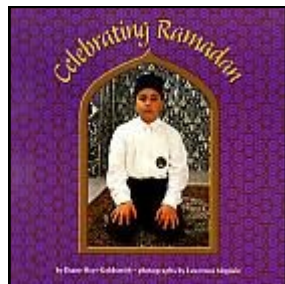

The telling of a young boy's coming of age in Jewish culture during WWII and the scroll he was given.



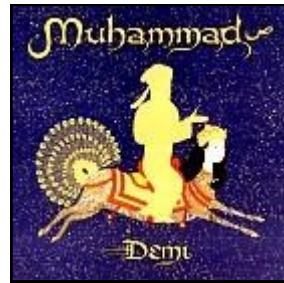
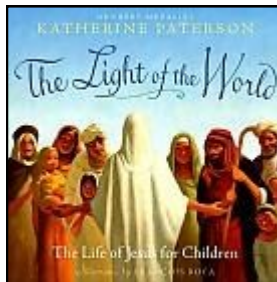
*Celebrating Ramadan.* By Diane Hoyt-Goldsmith. Holiday House, 2001.

The story of the life and teachings of Jesus who is called "the light of the world."

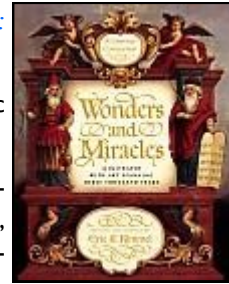

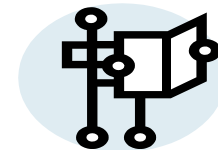
A version of the creation of the world based on Egyptian beliefs.
